

Supporting complex needs: Downs Syndrome

Course details

Participants will learn and demonstrate skills used for working with pupils with Downs Syndrome during the sessions and in practical settings. They will devise strategies for teaching, assessment, and resource making, adapting environments and creating activities for individual pupils for use in a practical setting.

Outcomes

- To understand the medical and social implications of having Downs Syndrome
- To develop strategies for teaching Maths and Literacy
- To differentiate teaching and learning appropriate to cognitive abilities and preferred learning styles
- To be able to manage behaviour
- To understand how to use appropriate Alternative and Augmentative communication (AAC) systems
- To be able to assess progress and set appropriate outcomes for Education Health and Care Plans
